Clearview Homes Mission Statement

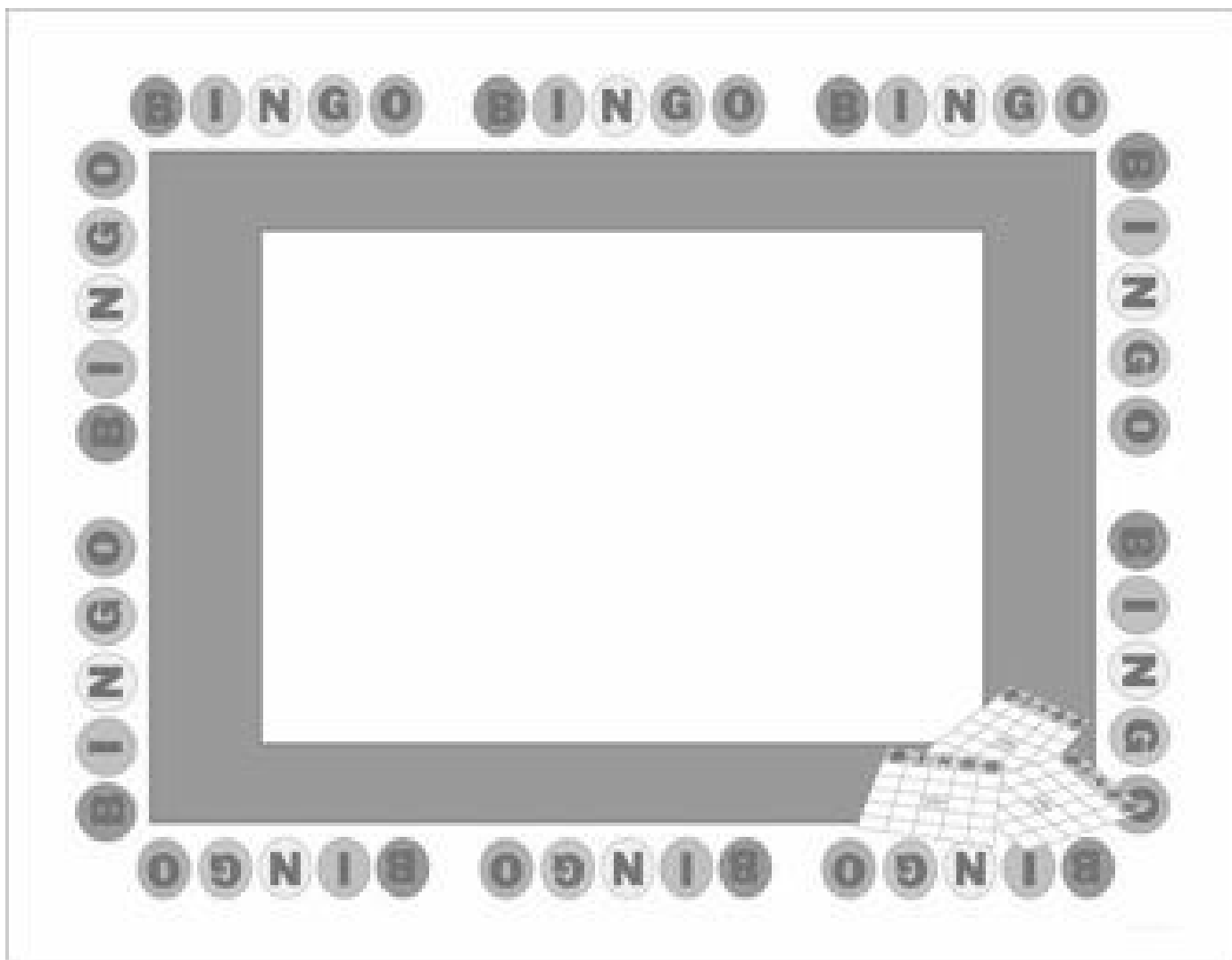
